IN RE: MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McAdams announced that Councilman Johnny Jennings lost his mother last Sunday. She said that the funeral is tomorrow at Tutwiler Baptist Church at 2:00 p.m. She said that her prayers and thoughts go out to the Jennings Family.

Mayor McAdams announced that Brian Finnegan, CEO Greenwood Utilities was in attendance. Brian Finnegan said that he appreciated the opportunity to be back in the community.

Mayor McAdams presented a letter with a list of debtors and the amount due to the City from Felicia Cage-Bedell, Debt Setoff Coordinator for the City of Greenwood, pursuant to the Local Government Debt Collection Program authorized under House Bill 991 during the 2019 Mississippi Legislative Session.
