Mayor McAdams announced that city hall will be closed Friday, April 7, 2017 due to renovations of the police department. She said that they are going to shut down the electricity power, the internet and the telephones. She said that the shutdown will separate the police department's electricity from city hall and the fire department.

Mayor McAdams said that Chief Banks texted her with some wonderful news. She asked Chief Banks to address the Council at this time. Chief Banks announced that the unofficial fire rating for the city is 0.54 away from a Class 3 Rating. He said that Southaven, Jackson, Gulfport and Biloxi are the only cities that are rated Class 3 in the State of Mississippi. He said the city currently has a Class 4 Rating. He thanked the Mayor and Council for their support in supplying his department with an additional ladder truck, radios for each firefighter and the new MSWIN Communication System. He also thanked Greenwood Utilities.

Mayor McAdams said that Chief Moore will speak at this time. Chief Moore brought Officer Greg Fernandez who had extensive injuries from a car crash in early January. He said that Officer Fernandez is making excellent progress in his recovery. Officer Fernandez said when he first went to the doctor he was told that it would take him six month to recover from his injuries. He said he is ahead of that time and hopes to come back to work in May. He said he has another doctor's appointment and hopes to return to work after the appointment.
