Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr. enters the meeting at this time.

Council President Ronnie Stevenson announced that we have our Greenwood High School 2017 Five Times District Champs in the gallery. He said they brought them here to honor them and to let them know how much they appreciate how they represented Greenwood and the Greenwood Public School District. He asked Coach Clinton Gatewood to address the Council at this time to introduce his staff and some of his players. Coach Gatewood said that it was a blessing to be here to see this recognition. Mayor McAdams said she talked to a lady from CGI Communication who would like to showcase Greenwood in a video.
