BE IT REMEMBERED THAT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE GREENWOOD CITY COUNCIL was held this Tuesday, June 5, 2018 at 4:00 p.m. in the Council Chamber of the Greenwood City Hall, it being the time and place for holding said meeting.

There were present at this meeting, Mayor Carolyn McAdams, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Andrew Powell, David Jordan, and Carl Palmer, and Cinderella Morris, Council Clerk. Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr. being absent.

Also present were: Eric Spencer, Angela Curry, Director of Greenwood Leflore Industrial Board and the Greenwood Leflore-Carroll Economic Development Foundation, Rick Allen, Jack Bilotta, Alliyah Sims, Delta News, Lauren Randall, Commonwealth Newspaper and Chris Williams, Taxpayers Channel.

Also present were: Mayor's Secretary Bettie Ray, Ophelia Nathan, Public Works Director Susan Bailey, Fire Chief Marcus Banks, Police Chief Ray Moore, Sergeant Melvin Cook, Charlie Swayze, Director of Community Development Division Victor Stokes, Director of the Waste Water Treatment Plant Division Eddie Curry, and Code Enforcement Officer Betty Stigler.

IN RE: AGENDA

Motion was made by Councilperson David Jordan, seconded by Councilperson Carl Palmer to amend the agenda to include a Resolution acknowledging the assignment of that certain agreement and supplemental contract between Supreme Electronics Corp. and the City of Greenwood. A vote was taken, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer all voted YEA. Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr. being absent. The President declared the motion passed and adopted.

IN RE: AGENDA

Motion was made by Councilperson Carl Palmer, seconded by Councilperson David Jordan to adopt the amended agenda. A vote was taken, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer all voted YEA. Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr. being absent. IN RE: MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McAdams advised Council that there was a sewer cave-in on Grenada Boulevard last Thursday. She asked Eddie Curry to speak at this time. Eddie Curry said the cave-in of the 8 – 10 inch concrete sewer main was in the 2000 Block of Grenada Boulevard. He said that five major pumping stations are on the sewer main. He said starting tomorrow they are bypassing the main sewer line. He said that a contractor is on board for tomorrow to repair the sewer main. Curry said that there have been two additional cave-ins in the last week or so, a storm sewer on Washington Street and a sewer line on George Street, which has been fixed. Mayor McAdams said that she is working on money to reline the sewer lines. She asked Curry about the status of the Waste Water Treatment Plant. Curry advised Mayor McAdams that the sewer line is still being bypassed until repairs can be made.

Mayor McAdams advised Council that the city clerk's position has been filled. She said she hired a young lady today and that she needs to go to the coast for training.

Mayor McAdams reminded all persons present to go vote today.

Mayor McAdams reminded Council and citizens that the Summer Parks Program is open in Whittington Park and Clerico Park. She said those interested can sign up at

Whittington Park. Chief Banks said that the pool is opening Thursday from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. He said they will be offering swimming lessons on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 4:00 p.m. until 5:00 p.m. and adult nights. He said four of his firefighters are certified lifeguards and that Charles Brooks, III has also been certified as a lifeguard.

Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr. enters the meeting at this time.

Mayor McAdams stated that MDOT right-of-way has been cut sloppy. She sad that she is hiring someone to come in and clean up the right-a-way.

Council President Ronnie Stevenson advised Council that he will handle Routine Item 5(b)(3) Resolution authorizing the City of Greenwood to provide a ten year exemption from ad valorem taxes to Milwaukee Electric Tool Corporation for 2017 expansion before the dilapidated housing agenda.

Angela Curry and Jack Bilotta addressed the Council about the Milwaukee Electric Tool Expansion exemption. Bilotta said that construction on one of the buildings has begun and that a second one will be built in the future. He said that the company has 648 regular employees, 111 temporary employees and that the company will need close to 1000 employees by 2020. He said that the company is working with the state to set up a transportation system for employees that live out of the area and for daycare opportunities. He stated that the company had to drop its testing criteria because some of the potential employees could not read above a sixth grade level. Angela Curry said that the unemployment rate in Leflore County was so low, 6.1%, that they have to work harder to find new employees. Curry said that they are looking at Holmes and Humphreys counties for employees.
