BE IT REMEMBERED THAT A REGULAR MEETING OF THE

GREENWOOD CITY COUNCIL was held this Tuesday, April 7, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. via Zoom Meeting by calling 1-312-626-6799 and entering the Meeting ID: 572 639 723 and livestreamed on Carolyn McAdams Facebook Page, it being the time and place for holding said meeting.

There were present at this meeting, Mayor Carolyn McAdams, Attorney Don Brock, Jr., Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Charles E. McCoy, Sr., Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer, Kim Williams, City Clerk and Cinderella Morris, Council Clerk.

Also present was: Public Works Director Susan Bailey.

Council President Ronnie Stevenson announced that he was going to do a roll call. Ronnie Stevenson present, Johnny Jennings here, Lisa Cookston here, Charles McCoy here, Andrew Powell present, David Jordan here, Carl Palmer here.

IN RE: AGENDA

Motion was made by Councilperson David Jordan, seconded by Councilperson Lisa Cookston, to amend the agenda to add Resolution of the City of Greenwood establishing a temporary curfew between the hours of 9:00 p.m. until 5:00 a.m. in the interest of public safety and welfare and Resolution authorizing the City of Greenwood to donate \$1,000.00 to purchase filters from Coburn Supply Company to produce medical masks for Greenwood Leflore Hospital. A vote was taken, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Charles E. McCoy, Sr., Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer all voted YEA. The President declared the motion passed and adopted.

IN RE: AGENDA

Motion was made by Councilperson David Jordan, seconded by Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr., to adopt the amended agenda. A vote was taken, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Charles E. McCoy, Sr., Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer all voted YEA. The President declared the motion passed and adopted.

IN RE: MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McAdams said that here we are again bringing the council meeting by zoom, thank goodness for technology.

Mayor McAdams said that unfortunately this virus (coronavirus) has taken (4) lives from our city and county. She said that it was a very sad day getting the call from Chief Banks that his mother had passed away with this dreadful killer virus. She said that she has thought about that call every day and the families that have lost love ones due to COVID. She said the realization is that the families had no contact with them during their illness and that they had to leave this world alone, except for the doctors and nurses. She said with that being said that is why we as leaders had to step up and take drastic action. She said that for weeks they have been asking, pleading for everyone to abide by the COVID-19 guidelines, staying 6 feet apart or social distancing, washing your hands often, using hand sanitizer, wiping all things down with Lysol or Clorox wipes and staying at home to slow the spread. She said they went a step further to ensure stopping the spread and flattening the curve by issuing a curfew. She said that no one wants to take these extreme measures, but that the city was being forced to do so because some people were still not taking our pandemic seriously and were causing others to not feel safe and protected. Mayor McAdams said that while other cities numbers have increased ours have increased too because of testing. She said that Greenwood/Leflore County has 26 cases, 4 deaths and 1 in a long term care facility. She said that if you go to the Department of Health website that you will see that we have been lucky because out numbers are not as high as some of the other cities

Mayor McAdams said that she thinks we are holding steady being proactive and doing this earlier in the game vs later in the pandemic. She said that she appreciates our police department for working diligently to educate people on social distancing and giving guidance to our businesses and citizens. She thanked Chief Bradley, Captains, Lieutenants, and Sergeants for their dedication during this crisis.

Mayor McAdams praised and thanked our doctors, nurses, medical staff, emergency managers, police and fire for fighting every day to help us stop the spread of this virus.

Mayor McAdams said that she wanted to assure citizens that she, police or code enforcement has not shut any business down. She said that these are stressful times and that she feels that we will get pass this awful situation and build our economy back.

Mayor McAdams announced that construction will begin on Fulton Street on Monday, April 13th starting at Front Street making their way down to Church Street.

Councilperson David Jordan questioned trash not being picked up and lots with water standing on them in his ward.

Mayor McAdams told Councilperson Jordan that the city is one truck driver short for the trash department.

Susan Bailey explained the situation with trash pickups. She said that a lot of obstacles are in the way. Mayor and Council discussed this further.

Council President Ronnie Stevenson told Mayor McAdams to go ahead and look at hiring someone.

Mayor McAdams advised Council President Stevenson that she is being cautious about hiring someone now due to the virus.

Council President Ronnie Stevenson advised Council that they will not be doing dilapidated housing today.

Attorney Don Brock informed the council that §21-19-11 of the Mississippi Code requires a Notice to property owners and the opportunity for a hearing before the Council before it the property can be determined a menace to public health, safety and welfare of the City. He said that since there was no in-person meeting and no ability to hold such a hearing, he recommended that all dilapidated property hearings which were to be held today be tabled. He said that Betty Stigler will still contact owners of these properties.

Motion was made by Councilperson Johnny Jennings, seconded by Councilperson Charles E. McCoy, Sr., to table all dilapidated housing matters until after the COVID-19 pandemic. A vote was taken, Councilpersons Johnny Jennings, Lisa Cookston, Ronnie Stevenson, Charles E. McCoy, Sr., Andrew Powell, David Jordan and Carl Palmer all voted YEA. The President declared the motion passed and adopted.
