City Clerk Kim Williams thanked the Mayor and Council for recognizing the clerks.
She thanked Ophelia Nathan, Betty Ware, Gloria Robinson, in her absence and Cinderella Morris for their loyal support and cooperation. She also stated that she and her staff will continue to serve the community and staff with great customer service and professionalism.

Mayor McAdams announced that the city is taking applications for the Summer Program. She said that about twenty-two young peoples will be hired.

Mayor McAdams said that Beth Stevens will speak at this time. Beth Stevens addressed the Council regarding Greenwood's Gravel Grind. She said that they had under 100 riders from other states to participate. She read a letter from a rider that was written in the Commonwealth's Letters to the Editor May, 2, 2019. She thanked Richard Beattie for his vision. She said that the Farmer's Market will open on May 25, 2019. A vendors meeting will be held Thursday night at 5:30 p.m. at the Senior Citizens Building.

Mayor McAdams recognized Boys Scout Troop 4200 who are working on their merit badges. She asked Troop Leader Dee Haynes to introduce his scouts. Turner Haynes, Connor Walls, Bailey Overstreet and Durve Patel introduced themselves to the Council.

Mayor McAdams announced that she will run for the 2nd Vice President of the MML. Mayor McAdams said that Allan Hammons will speak at this time. Allan Hammons addressed the Council regarding a Historic marker for the 173rd QM Co. He said that this coming August will be the 50th Anniversary of the return of Leflore County's 173rd Quarter Master Company from their service in Vietnam. He asked the City for a \$1,200.00 donation, half of the \$2,400 cost for a monument. Council President Ronnie Stevenson informed Hammons that he will put his request on the agenda for the next meeting.

Councilperson Charles E. McCoy announced that the Employees Appreciation Picnic will be held on June 6 in Whittington Park. He thanked all sponsors.

IN RE: PUBLIC AGENDA

MJ Fluker alongside Dilworth Ricks addressed the Council regarding Sexual Assault Awareness. MJ Fluker presented the need for the City to be involved in Sexual Assault Awareness. She said their program was adopted from another state. She said that this program is the only one in existent in the State of Mississippi. Dilworth Ricks stated that Our House has a nationwide approach to sexual assault awareness.

Danielle Morgan, Convention and Visitors Director, thanked the Mayor and Council for allowing them to be here. She addressed National Travel & Tourism Week, tourism numbers and awards to industry. She said that Delta Spirit & Southern Soul Hospitality brought in \$51,780,153 in expenditures by visitors. She said that tourism jobs will never be exported to another Country, 750 direct employees. She stated that tourists are temporary taxpayers that we don't have to provide infrastructure for that attributed \$4,040,469 in state and local taxes from travel and tourism. She said that on an average day in 2018 tourism in Greenwood generated \$141,863 and created \$11,069 in state and local taxes. She presented the city with a \$4,040,469 check. She stated that Tourism is Economic Development. She thanked the Mayor and Council for their support. She recognized board members present, Abgail Newsome, Cyndi Long, Tim Tyler, Jean Cadney, Kevin Brown, Beth Williams, Helen Gwin, and Charlie Godbold. She presented two awards, Friend of Tourism Award to Aubrey and Billy Whittington and the Outstanding Tourism Ambassador Award to Bridgette Matthews.

Menasha Chandler addressed the Council regarding a Notice of Violation she received April 30 regarding junk vehicles in her yard. Chandler also complained about her sewer not being flushed out at her home after calling the city several times. Betty Stigler and William Blake addressed this matter. Betty Stigler showed pictures of the vehicles and other vehicles parked on the grass at the resident the day she issued the citation and today. William Blake advised Council that one of the vehicles has a 2016 tag on it. Blake also stated that the Chandlers would still be violating another city ordinance that prohibits residents from working on vehicles in a driveway if it can be seen from the city's right-of-way. Council and Mayor discussed this further. Council President Ronnie Stevenson advised all present that per Attorney Brock's recommendation, a decision is being made to table this matter until the Council of said ward is present.
