IN RE: MAYOR'S REPORT

Mayor McAdams said that Cynthia Stanciel will speak at this time regarding Lead Base Paint.

Cynthia Stanciel advised Council that the City is working with U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) and Mississippi State Department of Health on a \$400,000 grant to remove lead base paint from houses. She said that lead base paint is still in homes. She said for more details to contact the Leflore County Health Department at 662-453-0284. She said that mold and mildew are in the homes too. She said that there are stipulations. Stanciel said that they plan to abate lead all together.

Mayor McAdams said that Betty Stigler and another department will go to a weeklong training on lead base paint. She said that the grant will supply the equipment needed. She said that a lady from the Department of Health will be here tomorrow.

Stanciel said that Mississippi Department of Health has issued flyers that she will provide to Council for their wards.

Mayor McAdams advised Council that she gave each of them a copy of the streets they turned in for repairs. She said that some of them turned in low amounts and advised Council to look over their lists again. She suggested that Councilperson Palmer could add more streets to his list since he had the shortest list. She said that she is looking at a General Obligation Bond around \$6,000,000.

Mayor McAdams said that the Pumpkin Patch is October 26, 2019 at the Downtown Farmer's Market Pavilion. She said that the pumpkins are free and that people will be there to help kids decorate their pumpkins.

Mayor McAdams said that the Witches Ride will be October 24, 2019 starting at Bowie Realty at 5:00 p.m. She said that all proceeds raised will benefit the Leflore County Humane Society.
